Woodpecker

Woodpeckers make fast drumming sounds by tapping trees with their beaks. This sound lets other woodpeckers know where they are and tells them to stay away from their tree.

Male gorillas (silverbacks) make drumming sounds by beating their chest with their hands. These chest beats tell other gorillas to stay away and can be heard more than a half mile away.
